	 Performance analysis of scores and audio and video recordings of contemporary chamber compositions representative of various music centres that are of significant importance to the music of the 20th and the 21st century; A creative approach to the role of, among others, rhythmics, texture, form, notation and the importance of those elements for the sound of a chamber ensemble; The inclusion of other artistic forms in the classes (dance, acting); Cooperation with the composers of the performed works, including, among others, commissioning them to compose works that take into account various performance techniques and their considerable degree of difficulty in order to develop performance skills; Cooperation with representatives of other arts for the purposes of artistic activities of interdisciplinary nature, instrumental theatre, happening, installation, performance; Using electronic devices;
